## *Policy on Open Access self-archiving*

This document constitutes the Warburg Institute's Policy on Open Access Self-archiving for texts and related material which has been accepted for publication in its Colloquia or Studies and Texts books series.

### *Self-Archiving prior to publication until 24 months following publication:*

For material which has been formally accepted for publication in Warburg Institute books, we permit self-archiving by authors of the version of the text and any authorial tables and diagrams which was accepted for publication by the Warburg Institute Books Series Editors following their formal review procedures, but prior to any subsequent re-writing, editorial or production work in the course of preparing the material for publication. This version of the material may be placed on any or all of:

- the author's personal website
- the author's institutional repository or archive
- not for profit subject-based pre-print servers or repositories

Please note that the Warburg Institute is not able to extend this permission to cover the self-archiving of any part of the material for which the copyright is owned by a third party, such as copyrighted illustrations.

We recommend that the self-archived material should include or be accompanied by a notice indicating that:

This text, {CITE AUTHOR(S)' NAME(S) AND TITLE AS SUBMITTED}, was formally accepted for publication by the Warburg Institute on {DATE OF LETTER CONFIRMING ACCEPTANCE} in the version archived here. It is anticipated that a final version will be published in Warburg Institute {SERIES NAME (EITHER "COLLOQUIA" OR "STUDIES AND TEXTS")}, volume {NO.}, {TITLE OF BOOK FOLLOWED BY NAME(S) OF EDITOR(S) IN THE CASE OF "COLLOQUIA" VOLUMES}, on completion of the Warburg Institute's editorial and production procedures.

The self-archived version may not be updated or replaced with any subsequent version, until 24 months following publication.

### *Self-Archiving from 24 months following publication:*

We permit self-archiving of the final PDF file provided to the author on publication of the book by the Warburg Institute. Again, this version of the material may be placed on any or all of:

- the author's personal website
- the author's institutional repository or archive
- not for profit subject-based pre-print servers or repositories

### *Terms and Conditions for Self-Archiving:*

Individual users may view, print, download and copy self-archived articles, as well as text-mine and data-mine the content for non-commercial and non-promotional research and private study purposes, under the following conditions:

- The author(s)' moral rights are not compromised. These rights include the right of 'paternity' (the right for the author to be identified as such, also known as 'attribution') and 'integrity' (the right for the author not to have the work altered in such a way that the author's reputation or integrity may be damaged. All re-use must be fully attributed.
- Where content in the article is identified as belonging to a third party, it is the obligation of the user to ensure that any re-use complies with the copyright policies of the owner of that content.
- The self-archived content may not be re-published verbatim in whole or in part, whether in print or online. This restriction does not apply to use of quotations with appropriate citation, or to text-mining and data-mining provided that the mining output is restricted to short excerpts of text and data.
