## *Policy on Open Access self-archiving*

This document constitutes the *Journal of the Warburg and Courtauld Institutes (JWCI)* Policy on Open Access self-archiving of articles accepted for publication.

For papers which have been formally accepted for publication in the *JWCI*, we permit self-archiving by authors of the version of the text, including any authorial tables and diagrams, which was submitted to the Editors and accepted by them, before the start of the editorial and production work in preparation for its publication in the *JWCI*. This version of the text may be placed on any or all of:

- the author's personal website
- the author's institutional repository or archive
- not for profit subject-based pre-print servers or repositories

Please note that the *JWCI* is not able to extend this permission to cover the self-archiving of any part of the paper for which the copyright is owned by a third party such as copyrighted illustrations.

We recommend that the self-archived text should include or be accompanied by a notice indicating that:

This text, {CITE AUTHOR(S)' NAME(S) AND TITLE OF PAPER AS SUBMITTED}, was submitted to the *Journal of the Warburg and Courtauld Institutes (JWCI)* on {DATE OF SUBMISSION} in the version archived here. It is anticipated that a final version of the paper will be published in volume {NO.} ({YEAR}) of the *JWCI*, on completion of the *JWCI*'s editorial and production procedures.

The self-archived version may not be updated or replaced with any subsequent version.

### *Terms and Conditions for Self-Archiving:*

Individual users may view, print, download and copy self-archived articles, as well as text-mine and data-mine the content for non-commercial and non-promotional research and private study purposes, under the following conditions:

- The author(s)' moral rights are not compromised.
